### **CHARLES F. CAMPBELL**

#### **Visiting Appellate and District Court Judge - 1995-present**

Sit around the state as a visiting judge, hearing both civil and criminal cases, as per assignment of the Chief Justice—also conduct mediations

#### **Judge, Texas Court of Criminal Appeals - 1982-1994**

One of nine judges on the court which disposes of 4,000 to 5,000 matters annually including writs of mandamus, prohibition, procedendo, direct appeals, habeas corpus and petitions for discretionary review. Personally authored over 750 opinions published in Southwestern Reporter, 2nd edition, and over 1,500 per curiam opinions. Shared responsibility for management of 64 employees with biennial budget of \$4,000,000. Directly supervised six attorneys and one paralegal.

#### **Assistant Texas Attorney General,**

#### **Chief of Prosecutor's Assistance Division – 1979-1982**

The work of the division included the investigation and prosecution of capital murder, white collar fraud, official misconduct and organized crime. Responsible for hiring and managing seven attorneys, two accountants, four interns and support staff with an annual budget of \$400,000.

#### **Elected District Attorney, Hill County, Texas - 1977-1979**

Investigated and prosecuted all felony cases in the county with a staff of one attorney, one investigator and two secretaries. Separately conducted a general civil law practice including family law, probate and general litigation. Retained by one bank and one savings and loan association on a monthly basis.

#### **Elected County Attorney, Hill County, Texas - 1972-1976**

Responsible for the prosecution of all misdemeanor cases and for representing the county in all civil suits. Handled cases of eminent domain and involuntary civil commitment.
