TEACHING

GRADUATE Pedagogy in Rhetoric, Composition, and Literacy Studies. ENG 6323. UTPA.

Students develop understanding of the relationship between key areas of writing studies to investigate theories about how writing studies operate in daily life and in classrooms; focuses on how pedagogical practices in the classroom reflect individual beliefs about how language works, how knowledge is made.

History of Rhetoric, Composition, and Literacy Studies. ENG 6324. UTPA.

Introduces students to the field of rhetoric and composition through research. Students identify trends. movements, concepts, and voices that forms multiple versions of the discipline's history; students identify research methods scaffolding the development of discipline; describe the impact of research methods on the development of the discipline; articulate major concepts/terms foundational to writing studies.

UNDERGRADUATE Freshman Studies Internship. ENGW 4350. SEU.

Internship course. Designed to help students succeed in role as a Freshman Studies intern in writing courses. Readings focus on responding to student writing; discussions focused on internship: interpersonal relations with professors and students, work load, the relationship between writing class and lecture, and so forth.

Current Theories of Rhetoric and Composition. ENGW 4341. SEU.

Senior-level course. Introduction to major contemporary theories of rhetoric and composition. End goal is for students to design and complete empirically-based contributive research projects, which can be submitted for publication.

Composition Techniques. ENG 4325. UTPA.

Senior-level course. Study of theories and methods of teaching writing. Review of major writing concepts (invention, revision, audience, genre) leads to student research projects. End goal is for students to be prepared to submit teaching portfolio, which demonstrates a conscious praxis for teaching writing.

Survey of Rhetorical Theory. ENG 4324. Hybrid delivery. UTPA.

Senior-level investigation of how "rhetoric" has been defined throughout history with goal of understanding how we use language to make meaning and affect others. Students develop an historical and working knowledge of "rhetoric" and "women's rhetoric." End goal is for students to understand influence of rhetorical theories on discourse.

Studies in Literacy. ENG 4323. UTPA.

Senior-level course that advances students' understanding of subjects, theories, and methods in literacy studies; considers how history of literacy influences activities of teaching, studying, and learning to write; cultivates expertise needed to conduct literacy research.

Advanced Writing: Style and Structure. ENG 3338. UTPA.

Junior-level writing course. Focus on investigations of students' writing practices as precursor the development of individual project: submission of extended, polished project.

Document Design, ENGW 2329, SEU.

Introduces students to principles of design and visual rhetoric. Students apply these principles to online and print documents, completing a digital portfolio for the ENGW major.

Technical Writing & Document Design. TexPREP Program. UTPA.

Writing course for high-school students enrolled in summer engineering program. Focuses on applying rhetorical and design principles to technical documents and genres, including job materials, technical definitions, and instructions; emphasizes applying field knowledge and expertise to document design for usability and collaborative writing practices. Co-taught at TCU.

American Grammar. ENGW 2320. SEU.

Course designed for students who need to bring their mastery of the terminology and principles of grammar to a level appropriate for teachers and writers. The course begins with basic grammatical points and moves quickly to analysis of the structure of phrases, clauses and sentences through the use of diagramming.

Rhetoric & Composition II: Reading, Writing, Research in College. ENGW 1302. UTPA & SEU.

Second course of two-semester sequence; emphasis on original, contributive research projects in and about writing studies issues and WAW. Students engage in a variety of writing projects, but self-design one major research study and presentation project designed to teach students how to initiate inquiry, engage in contributive research designs, conduct primary and secondary research, and disseminate research.

Rhetoric & Composition I: Investigating Writing Studies. FSTY 1311. UTPA & SEU.

First course in two-semester sequence. Writing-about-writing (WAW) pedagogy. Designed to help students become more effective and confident writers as well as more active and engaged readers of complex texts. Students engage in writing projects centered on their writing practices, giving them a vocabulary for reflecting on writing and its role in context. Also co-taught with basic-writing course. Run as studio, ENG 1320 supplemented ENG 1301 giving students more time and space to complete writing assignments. Readings and writing projects for ENG 1301 mirror non-studio courses.
