CLEP CREDIT ELIGIBILITY POLICY

- Repeating Examinations: CLEP examinations may not be repeated within six months of the testing date. Scores on tests repeated
 earlier will be canceled and test fees forfeited. Exceptions to this policy must have the approval of the Associate Vice President for
 Academic Affairs and the appropriate School Dean. Exceptions to this policy are very rarely made and are considered only when
 there are documented extenuating circumstances.
- 2. CLEP and DANTES credit will be recorded on the transcript without a grade.
- 3. Only official ETS [CLEP] or DANTES reports are acceptable.
- 4. No credit will be granted as a result of satisfactory CLEP scores to a student who has already received credit toward a degree at St. Edward's University in the same course, including transfer credit.
- 5. Students entering St. Edward's University as first-time freshmen must take at least one semester of freshman writing on campus regardless of their CLEP College Composition or English Composition with Essay score.
- 6. No credit is granted for College Composition Modular, Freshman English or the English Composition without essay examinations.
- 7. Arrangements for all testing must be completed prior to certification for graduation, and all examination scores must be submitted to the Office of the Registrar by July 1 for summer graduation, Oct. 1 for fall graduation and March 1 for spring graduation.
